

Directions to TT Environmental Ltd, North Heights Lodge, Wainstalls, HX2 7TR from Keighley and North Bradford

From Keighley, take the A629 to Halifax. Similarly, from Bradford town centre, come out on the Thornton Road until you reach the A629, and join it going towards Halifax.

From Keighley, the A629 passes through Denholme village, where it forks. The left hand fork goes to Hipperholme as the A?, but stay on the right-hand fork which is signposted the A629 to Halifax.

After Denholme, there is a large T-junction on the left hand side, with traffic lights, where the Thornton Road from Bradford joins the A629.

Whichever direction you arrive at this junction, you should take the exit to Halifax (if travelling from Keighley, go straight across, or from Bradford on the Thornton Road turn right).

From the large T junction, the A629 travels uphill, (watch out for wagons coming out on the left hand side, at the landfill), then goes downhill towards Halifax. You will pass a couple of pubs and the entrance to Odgen Water on your right, followed by the sign to Halifax Golf Club, also on your right.

About ¼ mile from the Golf Club entrance, the next right turn is into Per Lane, which you should turn into. There is a large sign advertising “Cobbydog” dog food which is a good marker for the junction.

Come down Per Lane for about a mile, until you reach a Y junction where the road goes on towards Halifax, or doubles back in a hairpin downhill towards Mixenden. Take the Mixenden fork of the junction, be careful as it is a narrow junction.

Follow this road through Mixenden, watching out for speed bumps and parked cars. There are two or three mini roundabouts on the road, but keep going straight across at all of these. (If you find yourself in a housing estate, you will need to retrace your path to the mini-roundabout).

After the last mini roundabout, the road starts to rise uphill (beware the speed cameras next to some new build houses), and the road turns sharply to the right. Keep going out into open country, and you will come to the Crossroads pub. Turn right here.

From the Crossroads, travel for about 150 yards, when the road forks, by a pub called The Delters. Take the left hand fork, which takes you in to the village of Wainstalls.

Follow the road through Wainstalls, past the turning circle for buses on the left hand side, down a steep hill with a bad right-hand bend at the bottom, and continue on Castle Carr Road for about a mile.

(Important note for SatNav Users: once you're on Castle Carr Road, keep to the tarmac roadway, and don't let SatNav take you off down a dirt track, as you'll end up in a farmyard).

A small cluster of houses appears. At the end is a gatehouse with impressive archway – come through the arch, and park on the right, behind the house.

The office is at the rear of the house, in a large outbuilding.
